Winter Preparedness

Winter is upon us already. Are you prepared? Here are some tips to stay safe and prepared this winter:

- Cell phone, portable charger, and extra batteries.
- Battery-powered radio, with extra batteries, for listening to local emergency instructions
- Be sure to check on older neighbors and family members; assist as necessary.
- Chemical fire extinguisher
- Smoke alarm in working order
- Carbon monoxide detector
- Extra blankets, sleeping bags, and warm winter coats
- Use battery-powered flashlights or lanterns.
- Never use charcoal grills or portable gas camp stoves indoors. The fumes are deadly.
- Avoid using candles as these can lead to house fires.
- If you do use candles, never leave lit candles alone.
- Drinking water
- Canned/no-cook food (bread, crackers, dried fruits)
- Non-electric can opener
- Baby food and formula (if baby in the household)
- Prescription drugs and other medicine
- First-aid kit
